In Pentecost Term 1 pupils in Years 3 and 4 will continue to follow the Come and See programmes of study; in Pentecost Term 2 they will begin to follow the new RE curriculum.

As directed by Northampton Diocese, pupils in Nursery, Reception, Y1, Y2, Y5 and Y6 will continue to follow the new Religious Education curriculum. Each topic lasts for half a term.

<p style="text-align: center;">TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH</p> <p>Early Years Pupils will learn that Jesus went back to his Father and sent his friend, the Holy Spirit. They will come to know the Holy Spirit as their friend. Pupils will also find out about their Parish; a family and special community.</p> <p>Year One Pupils will learn that when people open their hearts to the Holy Spirit they are changed. They will know that the mission of the Church begins at Pentecost.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DIALOGUE AND ENCOUNTER</p> <p>Early Years Pupils will find out about friends of Jesus; Saint Peter and Saint Paul. They will explore the idea that we are all called to be friends of Jesus. They will learn that people all over the world are friends of Jesus.</p> <p>Year One Pupils will know the cross is a symbol of Christianity and learn about their local parish church and community. Pupils will explore aspects of Jewish life in modern Britain and will know that the Torah is a special text which contains stories of the Jewish people's history.</p>

<p>Year Two Pupils will learn that Jesus appeared to his apostles and ascended to Heaven. They will explore the story of Pentecost and know that God sent the Holy Spirit as a guide for us all.</p> <p>Year Five Pupils will explore key texts about Pentecost and the gifts of the spirit. They will also explore the sacrament of Confirmation. They will know that the Holy Spirit appears under different names and signs through scripture.</p> <p>Year Six Pupils will learn that all Christians are called to witness the Resurrection by the example of their new life in Baptism, strengthened by the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. Pupils will explore different saints and consider how they bore witness to Christ in their lives. Pupils will explore how Christians meet Christ in the Eucharist.</p>	<p>Year Two Pupils will learn about their local Christian community and about ways Christians where they live come together to support the local community. Pupils will listen to the religious experiences of others from different communities in the class and the local area.</p> <p>Year Five Pupils will know that the Bible was originally written in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek which were the languages of the writers. Pupils will know the Tanakh (or Hebrew Bible) uses different names for God, to express different aspects of His nature and that the Shema prayer is the basic creed of Judaism. It encapsulates the intrinsic unity of the world and its Creator.</p> <p>Year Six Pupils will know that Catholics should work to promote love and unity and will know that Christians are responsible for promoting the common good. Pupils will recognise links between some Dharmic beliefs, practices and ways of life. (Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism)</p>

Pentecost Term 2 - Years 3 and 4

This half term the above year groups will begin to follow the new Religious Education Directory and will explore the **Creation and Covenant** topic.

Year 3 - pupils will explore the first story of Creation and know that symbolism is used to explain the relationship between God and human beings. They will know that all humans are made in God's image and have dignity and are created equal.

Year 4 - pupils will explore the story of Abraham and know that God's covenant with Abraham is the foundation of the faith of the people of the Old and New Testament; Judaism and Christianity.

MAY – MONTH OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

During the month of May, children in Key Stage 2 will be saying 'The Angelus' just before they go to lunch. This is a traditional prayer of the Church that is becoming less well known. The Angelus is usually recited at three particular times during the day; 6 am, 12 noon, and 6 pm. Perhaps you could encourage your family to pray this prayer together or to say a decade of the rosary together.
