

Curriculum Newsletter for Year 2 Lent term 2025

RE Books – children will learn about different books used in church on Sunday by the parish family. They will write a diary entry based on The Gospel of John about Jesus' baptism and information text about books that are used at Mass on Sunday. Godly play – 'Epiphany'.

Thanksgiving – children will learn that the Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God. Eucharist means thanksgiving. Children will write a Recount of the Last Supper. Godly play – 'The circle of the Church's year'.

<u>Opportunities</u> – children will learn that The forty days of Lent is an opportunity for Christians to seek ways to do good by prayer and by doing something extra to prepare for the celebrate of Jesus' Resurrection at Easter. They will design a poster describing some of the actions that Christians might do during Lent; write a Recount of Palm Sunday and an acrostic poem about Easter. Godly play – 'The mystery of Easter'.

Maths - White Rose Maths Units:

Money; Multiplication and Division; Length and height; Mass, capacity, temperature.

The children will use resources in the classroom to assist their understanding of new mathematical concepts.

Geography - Why is our world wonderful? - locating 7 continents and 5 oceans on a map; locating capital cities of the four countries of the UK; recognising physical and human features; showing on a map the city, town or village where we live in relation to the capital city, drawing maps.

History - **How did we learn to fly?** - finding out about people, events and beliefs in society, comparing pictures/photographs of people/events in the past, understanding how we use books and sources to find out about the past, describing past events and people by drawing and writing.

English

<u>Key texts:</u> The Tale of Jemima Puddle Duck The Way Home for Wolf

<u>Writing Opportunities</u>: instructions, fact file, advert, diary, script, descriptive writing, story, information power point (computing lessons), poem, chronological account, fact sheet, instructions.

<u>Grammar</u>: expanded noun phrases, correct tenses past and present, subordinating conjunctions, capital letters, exclamation marks, question marks, commas for lists, verbs, commas for lists.

describe how plants (light and dark) — children will learn and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy. Living Things and their Habitats — children will identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other. Plants 2 (light and dark) — working scientifically — children will investigate, observe, gather and record data to answer questions about plants.
