Differences: Boys & girls.	To introduce the concept of male and female and gender stereotypes.  To identify differences between males and females.	Understand that some people have fixed ideas about what boys and girls can do.  Describe the difference between male and female babies.	Similar Different Sex Gender roles Stereotypes Boys Girls Male Female	<b>PSHE</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The process of growing from young to old and how people’s needs change.</li> <li>• To identify and respect the differences and similarities between people.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk to your child about the differences they notice between girls and boys.</li> <li>• Try to challenge any stereotypes e.g. why can’t boys play with dolls? Why can’t girls play football?</li> </ul>
Differences: Male & female.	To explore some of the differences between males and females and to understand how this is part of the human life cycle.	Describe some differences between male and female animals.  Understand that making a new life needs a male and a female.	Private parts Penis Vagina	<b>Science</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.</li> <li>• The names of the main parts of the body.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk about the differences between male and female animals.</li> <li>• Why do the different genders have different body parts and what are they used for? E.g. Why do cows have udders?</li> </ul>

Name the male and female body parts.		<b>RE</b> Rules	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Try and use the words in the vocabulary list and not substitute words as these often trivialise or demean what you are discussing.</li> </ul>
