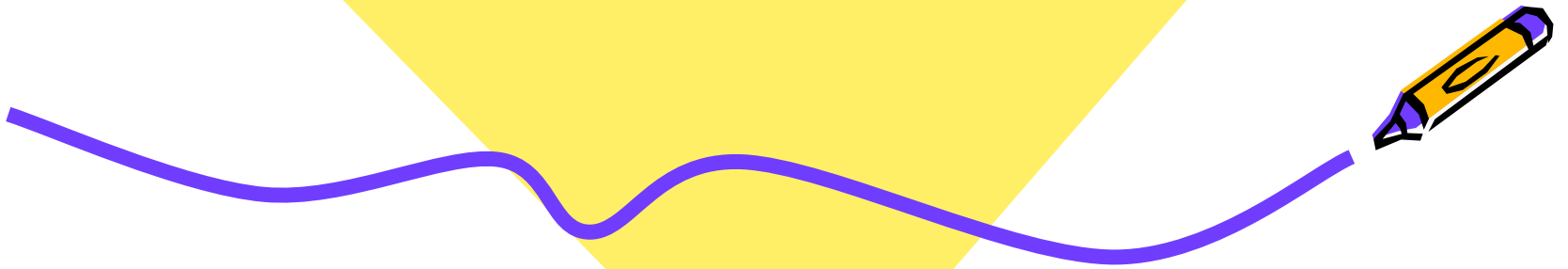

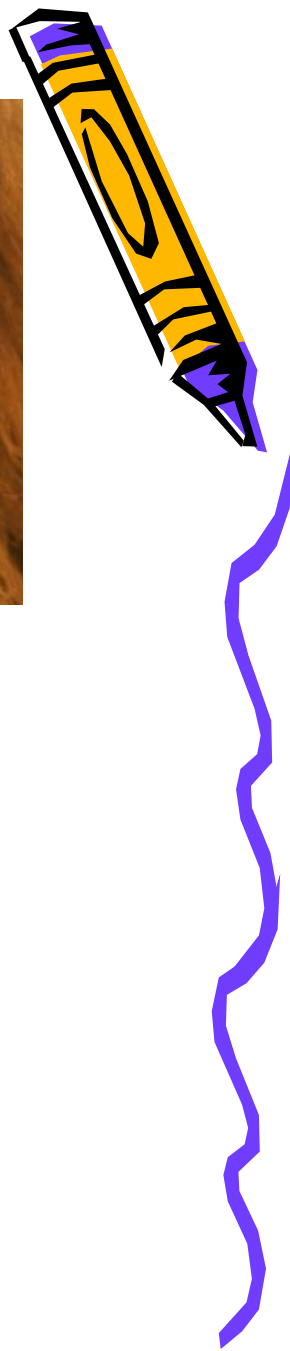


COLLECTIVE NOUNS

- It can be things like tables or trees



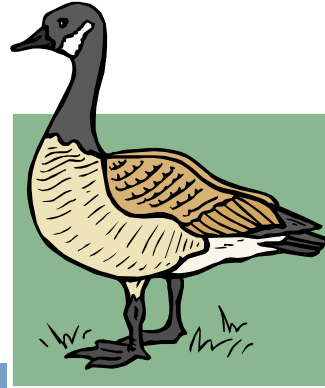
A lion

One hedgehog

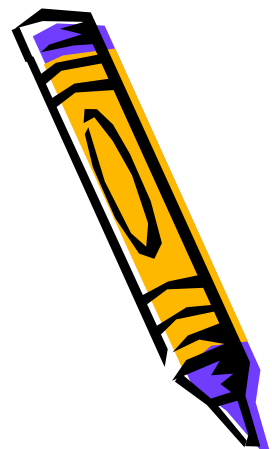


A prickle of hedgehogs





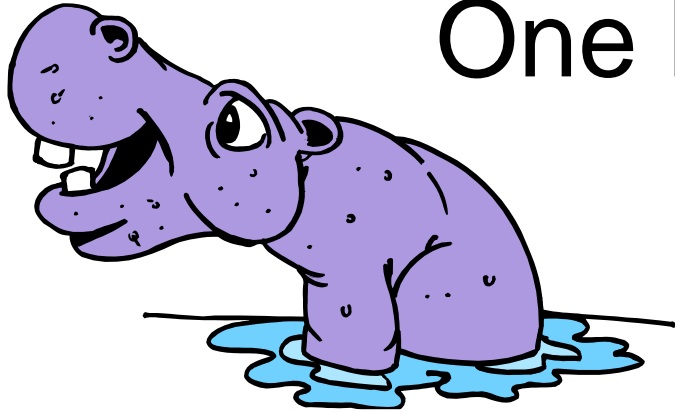

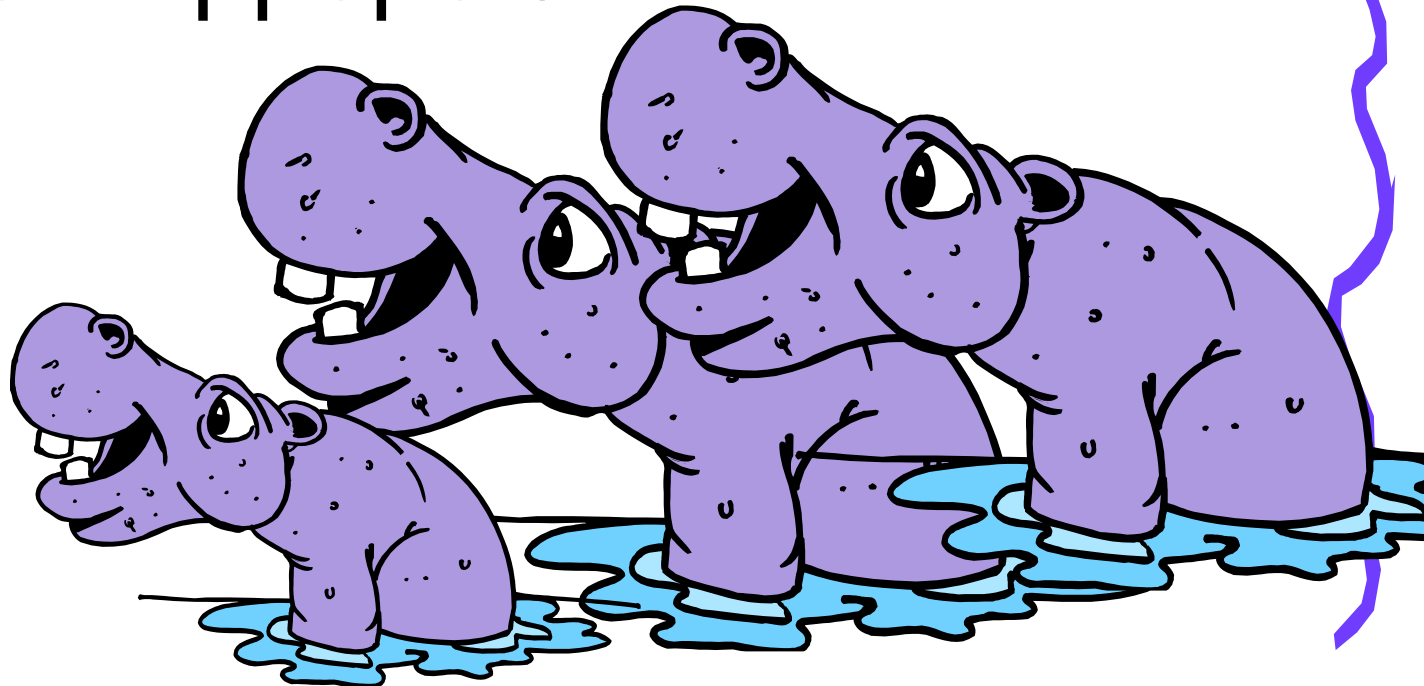

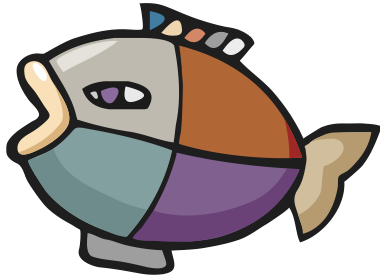


One Hippopotamus



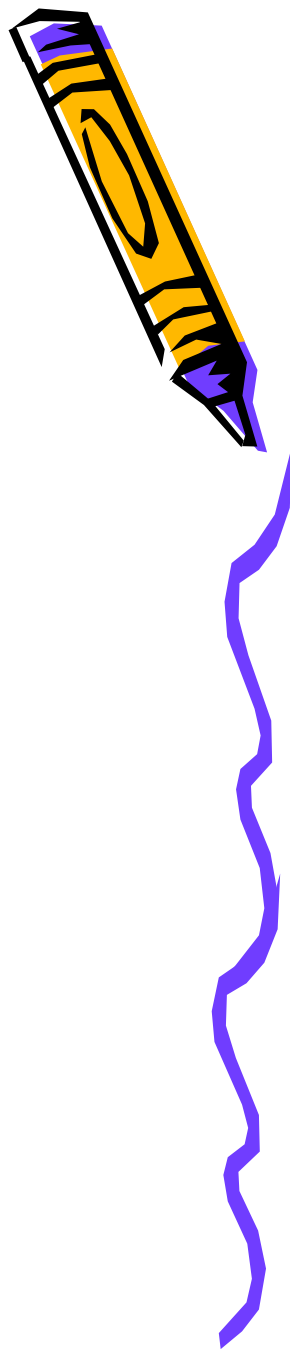
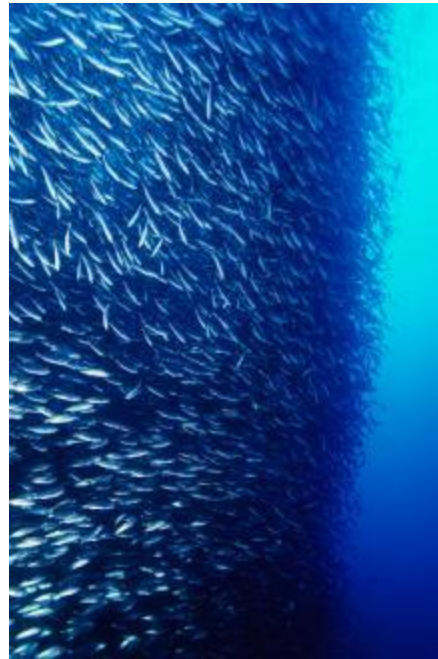
