


GOOD FRIDAY

Prayer of the Day

O God, who by the Passion of Christ your Son, our Lord, abolished the death inherited from ancient sin by every succeeding generation, grant that just as, being conformed to him, we have borne by the law of nature the image of the man of earth, so by the sanctification of grace we may bear the image of the Man of heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. AMEN

The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

*This is an abbreviated text. You will find the longer text in the missal or in John 18:1-19:42
It can be read by several people : N=Narrator, ✠ = Jesus, C/O=Other people*

N. They then took charge of Jesus, and carrying his own cross he went out of the city to the place of the skull or, as it was called in Hebrew, Golgotha, where they crucified him with two others, one on either side with Jesus in the middle. Pilate wrote out a notice and had it fixed to the cross; it ran: 'Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews.' This notice was read by many of the Jews, because the place where Jesus was crucified was not far from the city, and the writing was in Hebrew, Latin and Greek. So the Jewish chief priests said to Pilate,

C. You should not write 'King of the Jews,' but 'This man said: "I am King of the Jews."'

N. Pilate answered,

O. What I have written, I have written.

N. When the soldiers had finished crucifying Jesus they took his clothing and divided it into four shares, one for each soldier. His undergarment was seamless, woven in one piece from neck to hem; so they said to one another,

C. Instead of tearing it, let's throw dice to decide who is to have it.

N. In this way the words of scripture were fulfilled:

They shared out my clothing among them. They cast lots for my clothes.

This is exactly what the soldiers did.

Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. Seeing his mother and the disciple he loved standing near her, Jesus said to his mother,

✠ Woman, this is your son.

N. Then to the disciple he said,

✠ This is your mother.

N. And from that moment the disciple made a place for her in his home.

After this, Jesus knew that everything had now been completed, and to fulfil the scripture perfectly he said:

✠ I am thirsty.

N. A jar full of vinegar stood there, so putting a sponge soaked in the vinegar on a hyssop stick they held it up to his mouth. After Jesus had taken the vinegar he said,

✠ It is accomplished;

N. and bowing his head he gave up his spirit.

Here all kneel and pause for a short time.

It was Preparation Day, and to prevent the bodies remaining on the cross during the sabbath – since that sabbath was a day of special solemnity – the Jews asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken away. Consequently the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with him and then of the other. When they came to Jesus, they found he was already dead, and so instead of breaking his legs one of the soldiers pierced his side with a lance; and immediately there came out blood and water. This is the evidence of one who saw it – trustworthy evidence, and he knows he speaks the truth – and he gives it so that you may believe as well. Because all this happened to fulfil the words of scripture:

Not one bone of his will be broken;

and again, in another place scripture says:

They will look on the one whom they have pierced.

After this, Joseph of Arimathaea, who was a disciple of Jesus – though a secret one because he was afraid of the Jews – asked Pilate to let him remove the body of Jesus. Pilate gave permission, so they came and took it away. Nicodemus came as well – the same one who had first come to Jesus at night-time – and he brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, weighing about a hundred pounds. They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, following the Jewish burial custom. At the place where he had been crucified there was a garden, and in this garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been buried. Since it was the Jewish Day of Preparation and the tomb was near at hand, they laid Jesus there.

The Solemn Intercessions

For catechumens – those to be baptised this year

For the unity of Christians

For the Jewish people

For those who do not believe in Christ

For those who do not believe in God

For those in public office

For those in tribulation

For the afflicted in time of pandemic [This text is for this specific crises]

Let us pray also for all those who suffer the consequences of the current pandemic, that God the Father may grant health to the sick, strength to those who care for them, comfort to families and salvation to all the victims who have died.

Prayer in silence.

Almighty ever-living God,

only support of our human weakness,

look with compassion upon the sorrowful condition of your children
who suffer because of this pandemic;
relieve the pain of the sick,
give strength to those who care for them,
welcome into your peace those who have died
and, throughout this time of tribulation,
grant that we may all find comfort in your merciful love.
Through Christ our Lord. AMEN

The Adoration of the Holy Cross

in whatever way is best – hold up a cross/crucifix – for adoration

Behold the wood of the Cross, on which hung the salvation of the world.
COME, LET US ADORE.

HOLY SATURDAY

The texts are abbreviated and adapted from the Easter Vigil and should be used as is felt appropriate

You need a new candle if possible, and all can have their own candle if appropriate.

The Easter Candle

On this most sacred night,
in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life,
the Church calls us to come together to watch and pray.
We shall have the sure hope of sharing Christ's triumph over death and living with him in God.

These signs can be made on the candle as a priest does at the Easter Vigil

First you make the sign of the Cross on the candle. [It could be traced with a knife or a candle pain]

Christ yesterday and today, the Beginning and the End,
the Alpha, and the Omega.

Secondly you trace the date of this year – 2020

All time belongs to him; and all the ages.

To him be glory and power through every age and for ever. Amen.

You light your Easter Candle saying:

May the light of Christ rising in glory
dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

The Light of Christ. THANKS BE TO GOD.

If others have a candle/night light you now light them.

The Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) –

This is much abbreviated. You could look at the full text or sing a Resurrection hymn in its place.

Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult,

let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King,

let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

O truly blessed night, worthy alone to know the time and hour
when Christ rose from the underworld!

Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that this candle,

may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night.
May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star:
the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son,
who, coming back from death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity,
and lives and reigns for ever and ever. AMEN

The Easter Gospel – *we greet this by singing Alleluia for the first time since Lent began*
ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew [28:1-10] - GLORY TO YOU, O LORD.

He has risen from the dead and now he is going before you into Galilee

After the sabbath, and towards dawn on the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala and the other Mary went to visit the sepulchre. And all at once there was a violent earthquake, for the angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled away the stone and sat on it. His face was like lightning, his robe white as snow. The guards were so shaken, so frightened of him, that they were like dead men. But the angel spoke; and he said to the women, "There is no need for you to be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said he would. Come and see the place where he lay, then go quickly and tell his disciples, "He has risen from the dead and now he is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him." Now I have told you.' Filled with awe and great joy the women came quickly away from the tomb and ran to tell the disciples.

And there, coming to meet them, was Jesus. 'Greetings' he said. And the women came up to him and, falling down before him, clasped his feet. Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers that they must leave for Galilee; they will see me there.'

Remembering our Baptism

There can be a bowl of water if it is appropriate

Through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism,
so that we may walk with him in newness of life.

And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy
Baptism,
by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy
Catholic Church.

And so I ask you:

Do you renounce sin,
so as to live in the freedom of the children of God? **I do.**

Do you renounce the lure of evil,
so that sin may have no mastery over you? **I do.**

Do you renounce Satan,
the author and prince of sin? **I do.**

Do you believe in God,
the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? **I do.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered death and was buried,
rose again from the dead
and is seated at the right hand of the Father? **I do.**

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy Catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,

and life everlasting? **I do.**

May almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit
and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins,
keep us by his grace,
in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life. AMEN

The Easter Blessing

May almighty God bless us
through today's Easter Solemnity
and, in his compassion, defend us from every assault of sin. AMEN

And may he, who restores us to eternal life in the Resurrection of his Only Begotten,
endow us with the prize of immortality. AMEN

Now that the days of the Lord's Passion have drawn to a close,
may we who celebrate the gladness of the Paschal Feast
come with Christ's help, and exulting in spirit,
to those feasts that are celebrated in eternal joy. AMEN

And may the blessing of almighty God,
the Father, and the Son, ✠ and the Holy Spirit,
come down on us and remain with us for ever. AMEN
